

Ms. Cicely Campbell, MSW, LSW Director, Women in Transition Program and the Carl D. Perkins Act

Ms. Campbell joined the Tri-C community when she was going through her own "transitional" stage and became a county volunteer for the W.I.T. Program. Her professionalism and expertise were quickly noted and Ms. Campbell was hired on as the financial literacy coordinator for the program. Ms. Campbell quickly climbed the ranks of the Women in Transition Program, going from the financial literacy coordinator, to a student advisor, to the Interim Manager, to the Program Manager, all within a year's time. She was then promoted to the Director of the Women in Transition Program and then the Director for the major College wide grant the following year in 2012.

Prior to her employment with Cuyahoga Community College, Ms. Campbell worked for The Phyllis Wheatley Transitional Housing Program of YWCA Metro St. Louis, United Way of Greater St. Louis Region, and Planned Parenthood of the St Louis Region and Southwest Missouri.

Ms. Campbell received her bachelor's degree from Vanderbilt University where she studied Human and Organizational Development and later went on to earn her master's in Social Work (MSW) with a concentration in social and economic development from The George Warren Brown School of Social Work of Washington University in St. Louis. Ms. Campbell is also a Licensed Social Worker (LSW) in the state of Ohio.

Ms. Campbell, a Cleveland Native, has loved the work she has been a part of in various cities, however, she has always had a passionate desire to return home to Cleveland and be of service to her hometown community. Ms. Campbell is a member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority Incorporated, a mentor with The Black American Council of Tri-C, the Cochair of the Frances M. Franklin Scholarship and Protégé Luncheon, a member and treasurer of the Rising Leader Council of The Gathering Place, and a member of the Athletic Hall of Fame Planning Committee of her alma mater, Beaumont High School.
